AN IMPORTANT LETTER IS COMING HOME TONIGHT

In light of a serious case review involving the death of a mother and her child a fortnight later, action points were highlighted by the investigating officers and they include:

- Collecting three contact numbers for each child.
- Reminding and insisting that parents make contact with the school if their child is off ill. This will ensure that the explanation for lack of attendance is recorded and the welfare of the child is confirmed.
- The school to visit the home if no call has been made to us and if contact cannot be gained from the telephoned numbers provided.
- The police, and or, Social Care to be informed if no response can be made.

We will be following these suggested actions.

The report from the School Review has arrived, we are delighted by the strengths that were recognized. Some include:

- The staff in Little Ted's are very skilled at communicating with pupils with a complete range of developmental stages. They model excellent language skills.
- Similar learning experiences and opportunities are in early years as in foundation stage. Transition between the two phases (Little Teds and Foundation Stage) is excellent.
- Lessons in literacy and maths in Little Teds are well planned, and challenge children at appropriate levels. Effective questioning is used to differentiate and ensure children make progress.
- Wickford CE Infant School continues to be highly effectively. This is evident in its strong outcomes for attainment and progress as well as the views of its pupils and the high regard held by the vast majority of parents. Leaders are clearly committed to the ongoing success of the school and have galvanised their staff and wider school community to this end.
